RV teachers, Lisa Ellis and Nicole Walker, will be two of 37 American teachers working with the Invisible Children Teacher Exchange in Gulu, Uganda June 15-July 27.

Invisible Children is a non-profit organization that was created in 2003 after three young men from California accidentally stumbled upon the horrific tragedy occurring in Uganda, a small country in the middle of Africa. Uganda has been engaged in a civil war for the last 23 years making it the longest running war in Africa. The Ugandan government has been fighting the LRA (Lord's Resistance Army), a rebel fighting group led by Joseph Kony. Over the last two decades, millions of families have been involuntarily displaced from their homes and thousands of children have been kidnapped and forced to become child soldiers.

Invisible Children, Inc. focuses on long-term goals that enable children to take responsibility for their future and the future of their country through programs that address the following areas: quality education, mentorships, redevelopment of schools, resettlement from the camps, and financial stability. One of its programs is a Teacher Exchange, where teachers from the United States travel to Uganda to work with a particular school and teacher for six weeks. The goal of this program is to enhance present educational models and to establish long-term learning opportunities for both American and Ugandan teachers, generating collaboration among teachers from around the world.

The cost of this trip is \$10,000. Invisible Children encourages participants to fundraise since we are teachers, and let's face it, teaching is not the biggest money making profession. We would greatly appreciate it if you would consider being a sponsor. The contribution is tax deductible as Invisible Children is a non-profit organization.

- Make a connection between the text and another text, your life, the world.
- Make a prediction.
- Stop and think about what you have already read.
- Ask yourself a question and try to answer it.
- Reflect in writing on what you have read.
- Visualize what you are reading.
- Use print conventions.
- Retell what you've read.
- Reread.
- Notice patterns in text structure.
- Adjust your reading rate: slow down or speed up.

From Our Cafeteria

"Offered vs. Served" Policy

In order to reduce food waste and food cost in the National School Lunch and Breakfast programs, we have implemented the "offered versus served" method in our cafeteria. This allows students to decline food they do not intend to eat. Students are encouraged to eat full meals or make wise food choices in order to get a nutritional meal.

Breakfast Procedure

Four required food items are offered to students. All four items or any three different items may be selected for the student meal cost of \$1.00 for full paid students and .30 for reduced price students.

4 Food Component Items:

1. Milk (1/2 pint)
2. Vegetable/Fruit/Fruit Juice (full strength) (1/2 cup)
- 3-4. Meat/meat alternate (2 oz)(Two servings) Or
- 3-4. Bread/Bread alternate (Two servings) (1 oz slice equals 1 serving)

Lunch Procedure

Five required food items are offered to students. All five items or any three different items may be selected for the student full price meal at a cost of \$2.10 (elementary) or \$2.40 (Middle and High School) and .40 for reduced price students.

5 Food Component Items:

1. Meat/meat alternate (2 oz.)
2. Vegetable/Fruit (1/2 or 1/4 cup)
3. Vegetable/Fruit (1/2 or 1/4 cup)
4. Bread or equivalent (1 each)
5. Milk (1/2 pint)
